Literacy Strategy

Writing is progressive and skills based so that these skills can be applied in different curricular areas. Listening and talking opportunities across the curriculum include presentations, debates and discussions to ensure all learners are actively engaged in the school community.

Ongoing assessment, both formal and informal, informs all aspects of Learning and Teaching. We meet the needs of all learners, through appropriate challenge and support, to equip them with the literacy skills needed to progress and achieve throughout their education.

A rigorous self evaluation process ensures a shared understanding by all staff of our literacy strategy and its implementation results in raised attainment for all learners.

Monitoring of pupil progress by SMT within our quality assurance framework also leads to high expectations and increased levels of attainment.
